# Checklist for Leaders

## Where to start:

Register Your Campers online at [www.wol.org](http://www.wol.org).

Check your e-mail for confirmation and important details. You will receive a series of e-mails. All of our communication with you will be via e-mail.

Download Leader Info Pack from [www.wol.org](http://www.wol.org).

Download and print Camper Health Forms from [www.wol.org](http://www.wol.org).

Give a health form and other camper information to each camper instructing them to have them completed and returned to YOU.

Log on to your online account and enter your individual camper information.

Make sure your camper info and complete payments are finalized no later than 2 weeks prior to arrival in order to avoid cancellation.

Collect and organize completed health forms from campers

Special Housing requests must be entered into the camper information in your online account **no later** than two weeks prior to arrival.

Don't forget to register your leaders by calling 727-379-5081.

## Extra Details:

### CANCELLATION POLICY:

Deposits are non-refundable if cancelled within 61 days of your arrival.

All cancellations are also subject to a \$10 **per person** processing fee.

Reservations must be paid in full two (2) weeks prior to arrival or they will be canceled.

Make sure health forms are properly completed, as campers **cannot** be admitted without them.

Collect all medications from campers (prior to check-in) as you will be expected to turn in all camper medications to the nurse at check-in. All medications must be in original container with correct doses and instructions. Please have each camper's medications in Ziploc bags labeled with the camper's name.

**Note:** Florida State law requires that all medications taken orally be turned in. This includes: Tylenol, Midol, Vitamins, cough syrup, etc. Campers are allowed to keep their inhalers, Epi-pens and medicated creams, but must notify the nurse that they have them.

Collect and organize campers' spending money for the bank.

Be constantly in prayer for decisions and commitments by your teens! (**Please** start this now!)

# Spiritual Emphasis

Word of Life Florida Youth Camp is dedicated to seeing each of the young people who set foot on the Youth Camp property make life-changing decisions for Christ. We look to see the campers accept Christ as Savior, grow closer in their relationship with Him and demonstrate a desire to share their faith with others; each of the many spiritual facets of the camp ministry point in one of these directions.

- » During the **Saturday night rally** the gospel is presented and an invitation is given. Most decisions made to accept Christ during the week occur on Saturday nights.
- » **Sunday morning services** are designed to help the campers begin to understand and develop their relationship with Christ.
- » On **Sunday nights** campers are challenged to pray for and commit to witness to friends who do not know Christ. There is a time for youth leaders to meet with their young people, to pray with them and to begin to develop action plans for reaching their friends during this evening as well.
- » **Morning Bible hour** runs Monday through Friday. It is during this time that our speaker for the week delivers a Scriptural book study or a study on the life of a Biblical character. It is a time of growth for both new believers and established Christians.
- » The **Evening meetings** are specifically geared toward preparation for the Friday night Campfire Dedication service. We believe that once one gives himself over to Christ, the next natural step is dedication. It is in those Monday and Tuesday evening meetings that we explain to the campers the significance of dedicating oneself to the Lord as well as its biblical mandate.
- » One of our evening meetings has a theme or focus on the **Word of Life Bible Institute**. During this meeting we give the campers an opportunity to consider spending a year of their lives after high school studying the Scriptures in great depth at our Bible Institute on campus. Staff counselors who are about to graduate from the Institute share the various aspects of campus life and one of the Deans opens the Bible and typically shares a message on the importance of knowing God's Word.
- » One night is set aside for the **Campfire service**. During this time we give the campers an opportunity to dedicate their lives to Christ and to be used at His discretion, by placing all that they are, all that they have and all that they ever hope to be under His control. It is a very special time for the entire camp.
- » Friday night we also have our **Say-So service**. It is our final meeting with the campers and we give them an opportunity to share with the entire camp what Christ has done in their lives throughout that week. We also send them off with a message about staying true and strong to the things that were taught at camp; we encourage them to make a difference with what they've learned in the world around them.

**Quiet Time:** Campers are given a Quiet Time Diary to use during their time at camp. Trained counselors from the Bible Institute take the time during the week to teach the campers the importance of a daily time with the Lord, with the intention of forming a discipline in their lives.

**Seminars:** Optional Personal Evangelism seminars take place twice a week. The campers usually find the seminars to be informative and practical for both Christian living and sharing their faith. These seminars are a less formal time than the Bible Hours and Evening Rallies. 6

# Schedule

We are hard at work preparing a program for this summer that will be exciting for each and every camper that joins us. While the final details of this program will not be laid down until just before camp, we can give you a general picture of what the day will look like. The following elements will be part of each and every day at the Florida Youth Camp:

**Breakfast:** An ample buffet of fruit, hot food, and cereal will give your campers and you the energy needed for the great day to follow!

**Morning Bible Hour:** One of our dynamic Bible teachers will open God's Word every morning, Monday through Friday. The topics will vary from week to week, but will always be a growing time for both new and mature Christians.

**Quiet Time:** For 30 minutes each morning the entire camp will stop as everyone spends time alone in God's Word and in prayer. Campers will be taught how to do an effective Quiet Time, taught the importance of Quiet Time, and will be helped in the formation of this important discipline.

**Morning Activity:** Team competition will fill the remainder of the morning as the program guys dish out a load of fun that's guaranteed to be challenging.

**Lunch:** It is back to the dining hall for a great lunch buffet that is packed with noise and fun! Dining hall challenges and wacky competitions earn points for teams while providing some great dining entertainment.

**Afternoon:** Every afternoon is free time for the campers with numerous activities open for them to enjoy. They may choose to play in sports tournaments, enjoy the swimming pool or participate in things such as paintball, water tubing or the climbing tower.

**Supper Buffet:** The afternoon activity will have worked up quite an appetite by the time supper rolls around and the hot meal that awaits them is sure to hit the spot. With lots of supplemental choices for those pickier eaters, everyone is sure to leave satisfied.

**Evening Rally:** Each evening a pumped up rally gets everyone excited about what it means to live for Christ as various speakers cover important topics such as salvation, dedication and service. Great music, thought-provoking drama, and even some competition will complement the message each night.

**Night activities:** A flurry of activities is planned for the remainder of each night, such as team games, free-time, optional activities and special events. Before bed, each cabin will be led in devotions by one of their counselors, ending the day with God's Word and prayer. 7

# Leaders' Activities

We appreciate the work that you, as leaders, put in throughout the year, as well as the desire you have to see young people saved and growing in their faith. Realizing that you want to continue to be involved with them during their week at camp we want to do as much as we can to make this possible. You are welcome to join your campers at the camp any time during the day.

All Youth Leaders staying at Word of Life will be housed at the Conference Center. After registering your campers at the Youth Camp, please check in at the front desk of the Conference Center. At this time you will receive your Conference Center guest packet including your keys, meal tickets etc.; you may check in any time between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. Word of Life asks that no Campers be brought into the Conference Center at any time.

All meals for leaders will be served in the Conference Center Signature Dining Room. The meal plan includes three meals every day. Due to lack of space in the youth camp dining room, we ask that you eat all of your meals in the Signature Room. The Dress Code for the dining room is as follows:

- ⌚ Breakfast, Lunch, and Dinner - Casual (jeans, shorts, etc).
- ⌚ Sunday Noon Meal and Morning Service - dress clothes (Teen camp only).

We encourage all of our adult guests to participate in the adult activities program. This program includes on and off campus activities such as: water skiing, bowling, golfing, water polo, basketball, picnics and much more.

Check Out is on Saturday mornings, and we ask that you be prepared to pick up your campers by 8 a.m.

We look forward to seeing you at the Youth Camp this summer and we can't wait to see how God is going to work in the lives of your campers during the week!

## **CELL PHONE USE**

While cell phones have become a great convenience and are great for accessibility, we have found that they can be a tremendous distraction from the camp program. We would request that in the event you need to contact your camper call (727)-379-5600 or staff member call (727)856-7575 and we will give your camper or staff member the message. Campers may only use cell phones in the event of an emergency or between 10 p.m. and 11 p.m. to contact family or guardian. 8

# Upon Your Arrival

What exactly are you supposed to do when you get here? It's simple and easy:

Go to the **George Theis Assembly Center** between 2 pm and 5 pm. – located on the left after you pass the RV Park entrance and maintenance building.

Send all campers to the head check station.

Send a youth leader or parent through the registration process. Do not unload any luggage until after registration is complete.

Proceed through the following registration stations:

- » **Station 1** – Camper check-in – confirm number of campers, pay balance for campers and youth leaders if needed, make any camper or leader name changes
- » **Station 2** – Camp nurse – turn in health forms and medication. Forms must be completed correctly and signed by parents or legal guardians.
- » **Station 3** – Housing –Your campers may enter the building at this time to meet their counselors. Remember that housing/counselor arrangements cannot be made at registration. Please send special housing/counselor requests or cabin lists to the registrar at least a week prior to arrival. You may also request cabin mates and counselors on your online camp reservation. Junior campers are housed according to age groups – ages 6-8 and ages 9-12. If you have campers in both age groups and request to have them housed together, they will all be placed in the younger group. We do try to house church groups together. The counselors will direct you as to where to unload your luggage and your campers.
- » **Station 4** – Activities/Camper bank – Sign up for paintball, purchase a camp T-shirt or put money in the camper bank.

Adults who are staying with us for the week may now proceed to the front desk of the conference center to check into their rooms.

**CHECK-OUT** – Sat morning between 8 and 9 am. (Exception - last week of camp – check-out is Fri morning.)

**NOTE:** If you will be arriving later than 5pm, or if it is necessary to suddenly change your arrival plans (vehicle troubles etc) please notify the Conference Center Front Desk immediately at 727-379-5012.

**DAY CAMPERS** - Please follow the above registration procedures. You will meet your counselor at the housing station. Hours for day camp vary. Most day campers meet the counselor at breakfast each morning in the dining hall and depart after the evening activities. You may arrive later or depart earlier. Confirm drop-off and pick-up time with the counselor. Day campers may bring a back pack containing items they will need for the day - Bible, notebook, swim suit, towel, sun screen, spending money etc..

# Directions

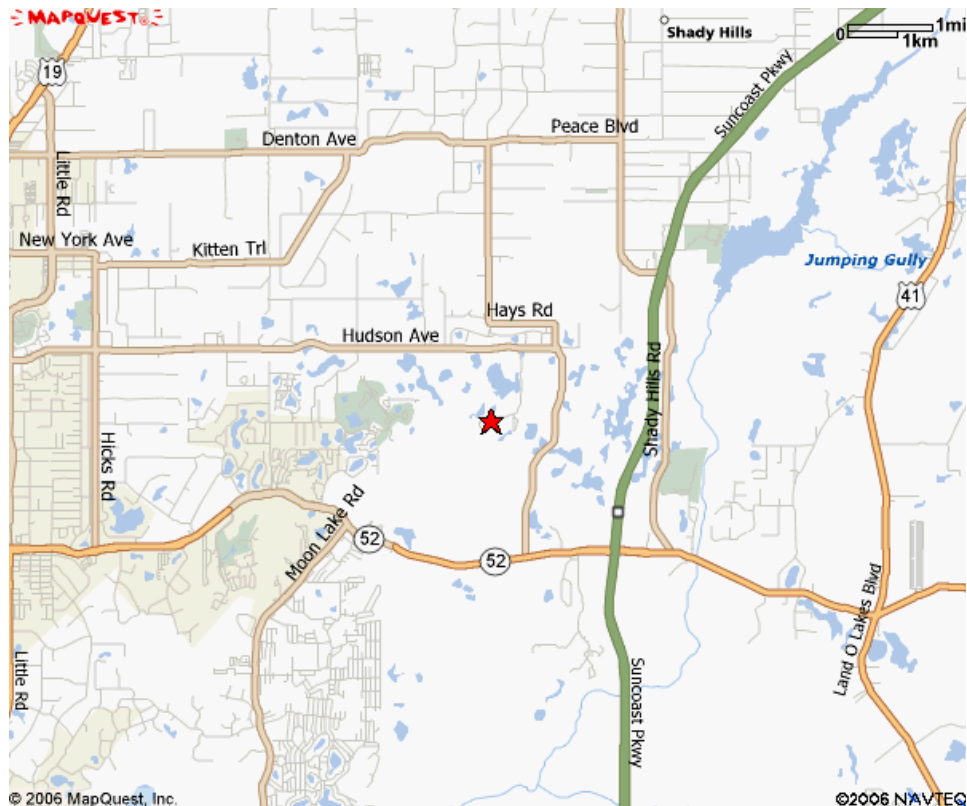
## Coming South:

- I-75 to exit 285 (State Rd. 52)
- Drive west approximately 14 miles
- Turn right onto Hays Rd. (2 miles)
- Turn left onto Hudson Ave
- Turn left at the Word of Life entrance.

## Coming North

- Use the Veterans Expressway North (Toll Road 589)
- Follow the Veterans Expressway until it splits and turns into the Suncoast Parkway (Toll Road 589)
- Bare left onto the Suncoast Parkway at the Van Dyke Exit
- Follow Suncoast Parkway North
- Take Exit 27 (San Antonio/Dade City - State Road 52)
- At the End of the Exit Ramp, take a left onto State Road 52 (SR 52 West)
- Drive for about ½ mile and turn right on Hays Road.
- Drive 2 miles and turn left onto Hudson Ave., then turn left at the Word of Life entrance

# F.A.Q.

## **Are there any additional charges for campers?**

We keep our additional charges to a minimum and have, in fact, eliminated some over the last few years. There are a couple activities that do have an additional fee, though, such as paintball and water-tubing. A list of the additional charges can be found in the "Optional Activities" section of this packet.

## **What if a camper is coming in by plane, train or bus?**

Round trip van shuttle service from Tampa International Airport is available. Please call (727) 856-7575 between 9 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and give us at least 72-hours advance notice to schedule a pick-up. There is a charge of \$20 round trip to cover our cost for transportation. A Word of Life staff member will meet you or your camper at the appropriate location.

## **What are the cabin facilities like?**

Campers sleep on bunk beds in air-conditioned cabins with bathroom facilities inside each cabin. Each room houses about 12 campers along with 2 counselors and groups are automatically housed together as much as possible unless otherwise noted.

## **What is the food like?**

The food served is of the finest quality and is prepared under strict supervision. A well-balanced diet is planned for each day. Campers are served buffet style and are free to eat as much as they desire. Candy and snacks are available at the Snack Shack.

## **What is the Camper Bank?**

We recommend that campers put their spending money in the Camper Bank. This can be done on registration day after campers receive their cabin assignments. The amount of spending money your camper brings is up to the parent. The Bank is open everyday and campers may withdraw money during afternoon free time. Word of Life is not responsible for any money or items not deposited in the bank.

## **What if I forget things at camp?**

Lost and found articles are returned COD upon claim by parents, up to **30 days** after the end of their camping week.

## **Can I call my camper?**

Please limit calls to campers for **emergencies** only. The Camp office can be reached by calling (727)856-7575 or (727)379-5600. A message will be taken, your camper informed, and they may return your call. No calls should be made after 10 p.m. unless it is an **extreme emergency** (i.e. death in the family).

## **Can I send mail to my camper?**

You can mail letters to your camper at Word of Life Youth Camp, 13052 Word of Life Dr., Hudson, FL 34669. Be sure to include the camper's name on the front of the envelope and indicate that they are a camper. Please also include the dates of the week(s) of camp that your child is attending.

## **Can my camper bring a skateboard?**

In order to use the Skate Park your camper must bring his or her own skateboard or in-line skates. Also, the camper must bring his or her own wrist guards, elbow pads, knee pads and helmet. 11

**Climbing tower:** Each camper may try his or her hand at our 40-foot, three sided climbing tower. Available all afternoon and in the evening under lights. The tower can be tackled by a beginner, while still proving to be a challenge for the most experienced climber. Word of Life Florida provides all safety equipment and all our facilitators are properly trained and certified.

**Skate Park:** Campers must bring their own skateboard or roller blades as well as wrist guards, elbow pads, knee pads and a helmet. You will not be allowed to use the Skate Park unless you have all of this equipment.

**Paintball** - Teen Camp Only: Each paintball session lasts 1.5 hours and can include up to 40 campers at once. Two teams are formed and various types of games are played on our large wooded field. Campers are required to wear proper clothing. Masks and paintball markers are provided as well as 100 paintballs. Extra paintballs are available for purchase in increments of 100 for \$5. Campers are not permitted to bring their own paintballs. Campers may bring their own guns which will be kept in the youth camp office between paintball sessions. Target practice is available for junior campers – first round is free – additional paintballs are \$5 per 100.

**Pizza Night:** Price for whole pizza is \$10. Campers may just purchase a few slices. Delivered to cabins after evening activities.

**All-you-can-eat Pizza Party by the pool** - \$5 – available during teen camp only.

**Camp DVD** – sold after Friday evening meeting. A review of the activities and events during the camp week.

**A swim test is required for junior campers who would like to use the pool.**

Payment and sign-up for the above activities and for camper bank will be made upon arrival at camp after you have proceeded through the camp registration lines. Please bring separate checks for camp registration and optional activities.

# DRESS CODE/Packing List

- **GIRLS:** One piece modest bathing suit apparel, Sunday clothes for teen campers only (skirts can be no higher than the top of the knee), sleeveless shirts and tank tops must cover at least half the shoulder and no tight fitting shorts, pants or tops.
- **BOYS:** Modest Beachwear (no bikini-style suits), Sunday clothes (for teen campers only), and no tight fitting shorts, pants or tops.
- **ALL:** Casual clothes, jeans, warm pajamas, Sunday clothes (for teen campers only), Shorts (must be fingertip length), raincoat, jacket, sweatshirts or sweaters and comfortable shoes.
